This course will depend for its success more on your written work, together with your class and tutorial participation, than on my input. You are doing the 'creating' here, not me! You will have two 'papers' during the course, in the shape of two short stories. The first paper will be due on the Thursday of week seven by 4pm. The second paper will be due on the Thursday of week twelve, also by 4pm.

You should keep a writing journal, writing something short in it every day if possible – some observation you have made about your stay at Wroxton, a thought, an idea for a story etc. You may be asked to show extracts from your writing journal in class or tutorial.

There will also be a short written assignment, (a story or some such), most weeks given by me, for discussion in your tutorials. These written assignments should be e-mailed to library@wroxton-college.ac.uk before the start of our next class so that I may photocopy the work and have it distributed to each student before the tutorial that week.

There will be a final 3 hour exam, which will take a form to be announced. Your class and tutorial work, including attendance, preparation, presentation, participation, together with all your written work, is worth 60% of your grade. Your final exam is worth 40%.
