#### **Essay Questions**

The first essay is to be handed in no later than <u>5pm on the Thursday of week seven</u>. Essays should be approximately 1,500-2,000 words. All essays should be properly referenced with a bibliography.

- 1. Critically assess different theoretical explanations for why we have a welfare state in Britain.
- 2. Explain why Sir William Beveridge's 1942 report on *Social Insurance and Allied Services* argued that tackling 'Want' would not be enough to solve the problem of poverty in Britain. What were the report's guiding principles and what assumptions did Beveridge make when he wrote his report? What were Beveridge's specific recommendations for tackling 'Want'?
- 3. What is 'poverty' and is it really a problem in Britain today? Why do some people continue to be in poverty?
- 4. Explain why Britain's system of social security utilizes insurance-based, means-tested and universal benefits. What are the strengths and weaknesses of each?

- 5. Examine the economic, behavioural and institutional causes of unemployment and consider how these explanations have shaped employment policy.
- 6. 'Recent government have remained defenders of the traditional family and have favoured strong government actions and incentives to sustain this institution. Discuss.
- 7. Explain why, despite the creation of a welfare state in the 1940s, personal social care services were relatively neglected in the immediate post-war period. Why did social care services expand in the decades that followed and continued to expand, despite Mrs Thatcher's desire to limit the role of social workers?

The second essay to be handed in no later than 5pm on the Thursday of week twelve.

- 8. "The main objective of education policy between 1944 and 1979 was to provide equal opportunity for all." Discuss.
- 9. Explain why the post-1988 school system may be said to rest on market principles.
- 10. Examine health care in Britain before the foundation of the National Health Service in 1948 and explain why a nationalised health care system was seen as beneficial. Why did Aneurin Bevan encounter opposition to the creation of the National Health Service and how did he overcome this opposition?
- 11. To what extent is the division between the NHS and the private sector blurred and indistinct?
- 12. Why did post-war governments invest heavily in the provision of public housing and why, in the 1980s, did Margaret Thatcher's governments encourage the sale of this stock?

## Notes on the preparation and presentation of essays

- a) Space should be left in the left-hand margin for notes and comments.
- b) You must place your name, and the full title of the question you are attempting at the top of the first page. Pages should also be numbered.
- c) Essays should be approximately 1,500-2,000 words in length.
- d) Quotations, references to other work and factual assertions should be properly referenced. Any referencing style (e.g. Harvard) is acceptable.
- e) A bibliography, quoting books, websites, e-books, articles etc. used should be included at the end of the essay.
- f) Work must be handed in by the due date. Work handed in late will be failed.
- g) Plagiarising, either from published printed work, the internet or from the work of colleagues is not acceptable and any essays found to contain plagiarism will be failed.

## Tips on written work

Keep it relevant! Be careful not to stray from what the question is asking you.

Answer the question logically. Set out the points you wish to make step-by-step, and support each assertion with relevant evidence. Unsupported arguments (however relevant to an essay) cannot be graded a highly as those which are defended by relevant evidence. On the other hand, essays should not constitute a collection of factual statements.

Every argument or assertion you make must be backed by evidence. Every piece of evidence you include must relate to your arguments.

Be cautious to avoid sloppy grammar, poor spelling and long sentences as they detract from even the finest of essays. It is always wise to re-read essays a few times after you have completed them to weed out such mistakes.
